MESSAGE FROM THE

SATRAP

The 2025-26 academic year is upon us, and with it, starts the Fraternal year. This brings a new beginning for our SEP Chapters, and for most of our collegiates, Rush and then Pledging activities. Rushing and Pledging are the lifeblood of our Fraternity. In fact, I firmly believe that nothing else we do for Kappa Psi is more important than the processes for introducing Kappa Psi to new students, who may become the new additions to our Brotherhood.

As we enter this essential period in the life of our Fraternity, I urge each of to take personal ownership and responsibility for the decisions and actions of your Chapter. To this end, I'm sharing my own "Top Ten" list of things every Brother and Chapter should prioritize for Rushing and Pledging this year.

- 1. Rushing is more about showing who you ARE as a Chapter vs what you do on campus. Let rushes see your energy, love for each other and commitment to excellence, and that will be more successful than showing them how many bake sales and road clean-ups you held.
- 2. Quality always beats quantity. If only a few belong, then only accept that few. Never compromise for numbers...it never works in your favor down the road.
- 3. Ensure that every single component of your activities has gone through a Risk Management assessment. Make sure that you're not harming your Chapter when you plan, by going through every level of that plan.
- 4. Involve your GCDs and your Graduate Brothers in every step of planning and execution. Not including Grad Brothers and a good GCD is pretty stupid! It's like going for an ocean dive without scuba gear.
- 5. Ask questions of potential pledges that give you real insight into who they are. If they won't share answers, they've already shown you that this Fraternity isn't for them, because we promote an atmosphere of family and sharing.
- 6. Pick pledges who you would want to have been the Brothers that pledged you. If you wouldn't trust them to pledge you, why would you pick them to pledge the future Brothers of your Chapter?
- 7. Don't sugarcoat (or lie) to rushes. Let them know that the process isn't easy, and it's meant to test them, challenge them and help them to grow.



8. Just because "they're so sweet" doesn't mean that they belong in our ranks. Anyone can fake being nice for a week or two. It's your job to look beneath the superficial and determine the basic character of that rushee.

9. If you make a mistake with #3 and give the bid, correct your mistake by voting that person out.
Remember, there is a specific percentage that the Constitution requires for anyone to continue pledging or be initiated. Share your concerns and even own up to your mistake in approving them...and ask your fellow Brothers to reconsider this person.

10. While rushing and pledging is work...it's supposed to also be fun. So have fun!

If you keep these ten points in mind, and do your best to incorporate them as you seek to grow your Chapter, I am confident that you will reap the benefits. I join you in your excitement for the new school year and wish each of you all the academic and Fraternal success you desire.







